- The essence of Australian Sport we are proud of our sporting ability and our reputation. Our society expects high standards of behaviour from all people involved in sport, and it is vital the integrity of sport is maintained.

Fairness

Operating within the spirit of the rules, never taking an unfair advantage and making informed and honourable decisions at all times.



Respect

Recognising the contribution of all people make to sport, treating them with dignity and consideration, regardless of their age, race, gender, ability, cultural background, sexuality or religion as well as caring for the property and equipment they use.



Responsibility

Taking responsibility for one's actions and being a positive role model at all times.



Safety

Encouraging healthy and safe procedures, preventing and reporting dangerous behaviour, while demonstrating concern for others.

Aggressive, threatening or other inappropriate behaviour by members, their families, their friends, and other sporting personnel while attending a meet, training or other event will not be tolerated.

General Behavioural Guidelines



Knox Pymble Swim Club promotes the following behavioural guidelines to all people involved in any way with the sport of swimming, particularly those responsible for activities involving members under the age of 18 years.

These behavioural guidelines highlight the principles and values of Swimming Australia and Swimming NSW and are the core principles of the National Integrity Framework and Safe Sport Framework policies.

As a person involved in any way with the sport of swimming, the following standard of behaviour is expected.

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others.
- Be ethical, considerate, fair, and honest in all dealings with other people and organisations.
- Be professional in and accept responsibility for your actions.
- Be aware of Swimming Australia's and Swimming NSW's standards, rules, and policies.
- Operate within the rules and spirit of the sport, including the national and international guidelines that govern Swimming Australia.
- Understand the possible consequences of breaching National Integrity Framework and Safe Sport Framework Policies.
- Immediately report any breaches of the National Integrity Framework and Safe Sport Framework Policies to the appropriate authority.
- Refrain from any form of bullying, discrimination, harassment and/or abuse towards others.
- Provide a safe environment for the conduct of activities in accordance with any relevant Swimming Australia policy.
- Show concern and caution toward others that may be sick or injured
- Be a positive role model.

- Follow the rules of Swimming Australia, Swimming NSW, Swimming Metro North East and Knox Pymble Swim Club at all times and in a spirit of good sportsmanship.
- Always give your best.
- Use the appropriate rules and guidelines to resolve a dispute.
- * Refrain from any form of bullying, discrimination, harassment and/or abuse towards others.
- Cooperate with your coaches, teammates, opponents, management, event staff and officials.
- Work hard both for yourself and your team. Your team's performance will benefit, so will you.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, ethnicity, cultural background, or religion.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another athlete.

- Maintain the required standard of accreditation and/or licensing of professional competencies Have a sound working knowledge of Swimming Australia, Swimming NSW and ASCTA policies, rules and coaching techniques
- Ensure that all Child Safe Policy and Child Protection guidelines are always adhered too.

Team Manager Behavioural Guidelines

- Be responsible for the overall welfare and wellbeing of team members and officials when travelling with a team.
- Maintain a 'duty of care' towards team members and accountability for the management of the team.
- Have a sound working knowledge of Swimming Australia, Swimming NSW, Swimming Metro North East and Knox Pymble Swim Club policies and rules.
- Foster a collaborative approach to the management of the team.
